


POSTER PRESENTATION

All accepted abstracts being published in the compendium of the International Symposium on Animal Reproduction -2014 have to be presented in poster form in one of the poster session.

Poster guidelines

- You will be assigned a poster number, date, time and location for poster mounting and removal which will be available at registration. Please adhere to the schedule given.
- A You are expected to be at your assigned space on the day during the arranged poster session to discuss your work.
- ★ The boards provided for mounting posters will measure 4' in length and 3' in height.
- It should be readable from 1 m at least, consequently lettering and photos/graphs/table need to be sufficient
- Assistance from the poster session committee will be provided.

GENERAL INFORMATION: Chennai, the capital city of Tamil Nadu, is located at the coromandel coast of the Bay of Bengal. Due to its location near equator, Chennai experiences hot and humid climate during all the three major seasons — summer, winter and monsoon of the year. Fortunately, due to its vicinity to the coastal area, it does not experience extreme variations in seasonal temperature. The winters are very short lived in Chennai. They occur during the months of November to February with January being the coolest month of the year.

CLIMATE AND DRESS: This is the most pleasant time of the year, best suited to visit the city. The temperature of the city varies from 15°C - 22°C. Winters too receive moderate rainfall, making the weather pleasurable and comfortable to travel around. Do not forget to pack an umbrella with you on the trip to Chennai. Dress will be formal throughout the conference.

TRAVEL PLAN: Due to time change and jet lag, the organizing committee recommends you consider arriving in Chennai by 2 December, 2014. This will enable you to relax and familiarize with the surrounding before the start of the conference.

PASSPORTS AND VISAS: A valid passport is required. All overseas participants/delegates are advised to make their own arrangements with respect to entering India. Check this matter carefully with your airline or travel agent as immigration laws are strictly enforced.

AIRPORT TRANSPORT: The conference venue is approximately 45 minutes from the International airport. Prepaid taxiservices available

OFFICIAL LANGUAGE: The official language for the conference is English.


TIME ZONE: Standard time zone: UTC/GMT +5.30 hours. No daylight saving

SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION

LANGUAGE: The official language of the conference is English.

CALL FOR FREE COMMUNICATIONS

Abstracts are invited on any aspect of Animal Reproduction pertinent to the theme of the symposium and will be presented at poster sessions only. All will be reviewed by the scientific programme committee. A maximum of one abstract per first author will be accepted. It is implicit that the abstract will not be presented in identical form elsewhere. All accepted abstracts will be printed in the compendium.

ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

Abstract should be organized and include aims of the study, introduction, materials and methods, results, discussion and conclusion **not exceeding 250 words**. A single A_4 white sheet (210 mm width and 296 mm height) with 1.5 cm margin, 1.5 space all text, an Arial font is preferred in a minimum of 12 point.

Title should be given in upper case bold letter, e.g: EXPRESSION PATTERN OF OXYGEN AND STRESS RESPONSIVE GENE TRANSCRIPTS AT VARIOUS DEVELOPMENTAL STAGES OF IN VITRO AND IN VIVO PREIMPLANTATION BOVINE EMBRYOS. Author names and addresses should be centered on successive lines. Indicate the presenting author by underlining that name. Abstract received in unacceptable form will be neither considered nor returned.

To assist others in communication after the symposium, it is suggested that the e-mail address of the presenting author be given as a footnote. Abbreviations introduced by the author can be used if they are given in full the first time in the text. Systeme Internationale (SI) units must be used. Generic names of drugs should be used in the text followed by parantheses by the proprietary name and supplier. It is the author's responsibility to prepare a completely correct abstract, ready for printing. All information and correspondence will be sent to the presenting author. Please make sure to provide a complete address on the enclosed abstract registration form to assure that correspondence arrives promptly.

The deadline for receiving the abstracts is 31 October, 2014. A completed symposium registration form and the registration fee must accompany abstracts in order to be published.
