I request that the following matter may kindly be published in your esteemed daily:

Sell Red Chillies Immediately after Harvest

India is the largest producer, consumer and exporter of chillies in the world. In 2013-14, chillies were cultivated in an area of 7.75 lakh hectares and production of 14.92 lakh tonnes. The cultivation area was decreased by 2.39 (7.94 lakhs hectares) per cent where as the production was increased by 14.42 (13.04 lakh tonnes) per cent compared to previous year of 2012-13. India exports to USA, UAE, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Pakistan and Indonesia.

In India, chillies are mainly grown in Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Telungana and Karnataka states. Lengthy chillies are grown in these states. But in Tamil Nadu, the Samba type chillies (lengthy chillies) are confined to Tuticorin and part of Virudhunagar districts and Mundu type chillies are mostly grown in Ramanathapuram and Virudhunagar Districts. Among these chillies, Mundu type has moderate pungency and there is strong consumer preference for Mundu in Kancheepuram, Chennai, Coimbatore, Erode and Tirupur districts.

In Tamil Nadu, Mundu type chillies are cultivated as rainfed crop during August-September and harvest will commence towards end of January and end with last week of March. Only single crop in a year is practiced in Tamil Nadu. Hence, traders are intended to pile their stock during this harvest period according to their year round demands.

At present, the price for Mundu type red chillies are ruling around Rs 100-110 per

kg in Ramanathapuram markets, Rs. 90 - 100 per kg in Paramakudi and Virudhunagar

markets and Samba type red chillies rule around Rs. 70 - 75 per kg in Vilathikulam

market.

In this situation to advise the farmers on stock or sell their produce upon harvest,

the Back Office of Agro Marketing Intelligence and Business Promotion Centre (AMI

&BPC) operating in the Centre for Agricultural and Rural Development Studies

(CARDS), Tamil Nadu Agricultural University has analyzed the last five year prices in

Ramanathapuram Market Committee for Mundu and Vilathikulam Regulated Market

price for Samba to give forecast.

The result of the price data analysis and traders survey indicated that, the price of

Mundu type red chillies will start decline after March 2015 and the price will rule

around Rs. 95 - 100 per kg in wholesale commission markets in Ramanathapuram and

Virudhunagar Districts and samba type red chillies will rule around Rs. 55 - 60 per kg in

Vilathikulam market. From April, there is a chance for decline in price. Hence, farmers

are advised to sell their produce immediately after harvest.
