National Defence College Officers visit TNAU



Officers of the National Defence College, New Delhi visited Tamil Nadu Agicultural University on 12-3-2012. Totally 14 Officers comprising of Brigadiers, Air Commodore, Group Captains including 3 Officers from abroad, headed by Air Vice-Marshall Th. Arvind Verma visited TNAU as part of their economy, science and technology tour.

Dr. P. Subbian, Registrar of the University received the Officers and briefed about the various achievements and ongoing activities of Tamil Nadu Agricultural University. He highlighted the organizational structure of the University, ongoing R & D work related to SRI, SSI, Precision Farming, frontier research in the field of Nano Science & Technology, Plant Genetic Resources, Remote Sensing and Geographical Information System. "About nine technologies of Tamil Nadu Agricultural University have been patented so far and 36 technologies have been filed for patenting" he added. Role of Agri-business Directorate in entrepreneurship development, mealy bug management through biological tools, and initiatives under National Agricultural Innovation Programme, Automatic Weather Stations installation in all blocks of Tamil Nadu, video conferencing for problem solving and dissemination of market information through Domestic and Export Market Intelligence Cell, Community Radio Station, Open and Distance Learning programmes were highlighted by the Registrar during the discussion.

Th. Arvind Verma, Air Vice-Marshall in his remarks emphasized that the National Security Architecture is part of the course training at National Defence College, being taught in the fields of Economy, Science and Technology. India being an agrarian country, where more than 70 per cent of the population depends on agriculture, exposure to agriculture will provide knowledge on food and nutritional security, essential to strengthen the National security base. In that perspective, visit to Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, the pioneer Agricultural University of the country, is appropriate. From the visit it is learnt that Indian agriculture is the oldest in the globe and many technologies start their journey from India and make a round in the world and come back to India with slight alteration and attraction he added.

The officers were exposed to the Precision Farming activities, Agri-portal development, and ongoing research on water saving technologies of the Water Technology Centre.
