A new alien weed namely Solanum carolinse has been found to invade widely in states like Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka. The weed species was identified in the garbage dumps of the rural area. At



the end of the meeting it was decided to control this alien invasive weed in the garbage area before it spread its

roots into the cropped area which may cause catrosphic effect on the production of crops.

Training on papaya mealy bug >>>

Inaugurating the State Level Training programme for the programme coordinators and subject matter specialists of 32 Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs) in Tamil Nadu and Puducherry on "Strategies to mitigate Papaya Mealy Bug" organized at the Directorate of Extension Education on August 24, 2009, Dr. P.
