General Advisory:

Owing to high maximum temperature and moderate wind, more moisture loss is expected and hence, more irrigation should be given to the standing crops.

Livestock:

Artificial insemination of goats and cows should be done within 9 am or after 4pm due to the high heat of the day.

For livestock, the heat stress can be managed by spraying/ sprinkling water directly on the body of animals for a period of 1 to 5 minutes at an interval of 30-60 minutes. Cover the sides of the cow shed with wet gunny bags. Ensure the increased mineral supplementation to the animals during hot weather to meet the increased demand for minerals. Agriculture:

As the temperature is expected to increase in the forthcoming days, sucking pest infestation may be prevalent in vegetables, pulses and groundnut crops. Hence, 5% Neem seed kernel extract may be sprayed to control the pest incidence.

Wind with the speed of 12 to 20 kmphis expected for the next five days. Hence farmers are advised to provide propping in sugarcane and to provide adequate support for crops like Banana, Papaya, Guava and Moringa, to prevent from lodging. For Gourds check the structures /pandhals for damages in the strings and poles and provide adequate support. Postpone the spraying activity.

Weather Based Agro-Advisories: (Jasmine, Tomato & Animal Husbandry).

Jasmine:

Mulching is advised to overcome the ill effects of high temperatures in flower gardens.

Further farmers are requested to monitor the incidence of Thrips attack and if required spray Neem Seed Kernel Extract @ 5%.

Tomato:

Due to the prevailing weather conditions, the Early leaf blight disease is predominant in tomatogrowing areas.

For the management of this disease, remove and destroy the infected crop debris.

For effective disease control, spray the crop with Chlorothalonil @ 2g/litre or Copper hydroxide 2g/litre at fortnight intervals.

Animal Husbandry:

Farmers are advised to deworm their goats for Round / Tap Worms for the months of May and June. The deworming should be done in the morning and the goat should be on an empty stomach.
