CAMPUS INTERVIEWS FOR TNAU GRADUATES



The Directorate of Students' Welfare at the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore, conducted a series of Campus Interviews during May 21-25, 2007 with a view to provide immediate placement to fresh graduates emerged in the month of April 2007. Over 350 students from all the ten constituent colleges of TNAU attended a week long Campus Interviews. In the inaugural address held on 21.05.2007, Dr. M. Thangaraju, Director (Students' Welfare) narrated that, the curriculum has been rigorously revised to ensure that, the graduates are suitable to the changing scenario in Indian industries and job market.
