MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CROP WEATHER WATCH GROUP HELD ON 15.06.2007.

Presentations in the meeting

Rainfall & Temperature (As reported by India Meteorological Department, (IMD)

MONSOON WATCH

- Southwest monsoon has further advanced into entire Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Northeastern States, West Bengal & Sikkim, Bihar, most parts of Jharkhand & Andhra Pradesh and some parts of South Maharashtra, South Chhattisgarh, Orissa, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- Conditions are favourable for further advance of Southwest monsoon into some more parts of Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Orissa, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand during 16th – 18th June, 2007.

Rainfall during the week ending on 13th June, 2007

- Fairly widespread rainfall with isolated heavy to very heavy fall occurred over Northeast India.
- Scattered to fairly widespread rainfall occurred over West Bengal & Sikkim, Orissa, Jharkhand.
- Isolated rainfall occurred over Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand.
- Fairly widespread rainfall occurred over Kerala, Coastal Karnataka, South Konkan & Goa during the week and scattered to fairly widespread rainfall occurred over Interior Karnataka on few days of the week.
- **Isolated rainfall** occurred over remaining parts of South India, Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, South Maharashtra, Marathawada and East Madhya Pradesh on a few days.
- The weather was mainly dry over the remaining parts of the country.

Cumulative seasonal rainfall (1st June to 13th June, 2007)

• Out of 36 meteorological sub-divisions, rainfall during the week was in excess / normal in 12, deficient / scanty in 24 sub-divisions.

Heat Wave Conditions

- Heat wave to severe heat wave conditions prevailed over some parts of North Rajasthan and heat wave conditions prevailed over some parts of Haryana during the week. Heat wave conditions also prevailed over some parts of Punjab & Central India during the period $7^{\text{th}} 10^{\text{th}}$ June, 07.
- The maximum temperatures were above normal by 2-7° C over northwest & West India during the week.
- They were near normal on 7th & 8th and below normal by 2-6° C on remaining days of the week over East India.
- They were below normal by 2-6° C during 8-11 June and normal on remaining days of the week over NE India.
- They were above normal by $2-6^{\circ}$ C over central India during the week.
- The maximum temperatures were below normal by 2-7° C on 7th and normal on 8th and were above normal by 2-5° C remaining days of the week over south India

North-east India - Bihar, Jharkhand, Orissa, West Bengal, Sikkim, Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, and Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

¹ North-west India - Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi, Punjab, Uttaranchal, Himachal Pradesh, and Jammu and Kashmir. Central India - Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra and Gujarat

South Peninsula - Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu & Pondicherry, Kerala and Lakshadweep.

Weather Outlook / Forecast for the period 8th - 14th June, 2007 by IMD

Outlook for the Week Ending on 20th June, 2007

- Southwest monsoon is likely to advance further into some more parts of Maharashtra, East India and some parts of Chhattisgarh, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh.
- Fairly widespread rainfall is likely over West Coast, Indo-Gangetic plains, Northeastern States and Western Himalayan region.
- Numerical Weather Prediction model suggests formation of low pressure area over West-Central and adjoining Northwest Bay of Bengal towards the end of the week.

Zone-wise Weather Forecast:

North-West India (J&K, HP, Uttaranchal, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, West UP)

- Rain thundershower are likely at many places over the region.
- Further fall in day temperature over the region.

East India (East UP, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Orissa, NE States)

• Rain thundershower are likely at many places over the region outside Interior Orissa where it may be at a few places.

North-East India (Arunachal Pradesh, NMM&T, Assam Meghalaya)

• *Rain / thundershowers are likely at many places over the region.*

Central India (MP, Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha)

• *Rain / thundershowers are likely at a few places over the region.*

South India (Tamil Nadu, AP, Kerala, Karnataka, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Lakshadweep)

• Rain / thundershowers are likely at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Coastal Karnataka, Kerala, Lakshadweep and at a few places over the rest region.

West India (Maharashtra, Other than Vidarbha, Gujarat, Rajasthan)

• Rain / thundershowers are likely at many places over Konkan & Goa and at a few places over Madhya Maharashtra, Marathawada & Gujarat region and isolated over rest region.


Reservoir Status (For the week ending on 14.06.2007)

- The **Central Water Commission** monitors the live storage of 76 important/major reservoirs, having Full Reservoir Level (FRL) of 133.02 billion cubic meters (BCM), which is about 63% of total reservoir capacity in the country.
- Water stock in 76 major reservoirs decreased to 30.76 BCM from 31.41 BCM reported last week. The current storage is less than the last year's position by 2.81 BCM and more than the average of last 10 year's storage by 9.59 BCM.

- There were 54 reservoirs having storage more than 80%, 6 reservoirs having storage between 50% to 80% and 6 reservoirs having storage between 30% to 50% of Normal Storage.
- There were six reservoirs namely Vaigai (TN), Ghataprabha, Malaprabha (Renuka), Vanivilas Sagar & Hemavathy (KAR) and Bhima (Ujjani) (MAHA) having storage less than 30% of normal and there was no live storage in four reservoirs namely Sriramsagar (A.P.), Kabini & Krishnaraja Sagar (KAR) and Kangsabati (WB).

During the week, prices of most of the essential agricultural commodities namely Rice, Wheat, Atta, Tur dal, Sugar, Groundnut oil, Mustard oil, Vanaspati, and Milk remained at the same level as they were last week. Rise in prices was noted in **Potato** (Re. 1.00 per kg 9.1%) and **Onion** (Re. 1.00 per kg, 10.0\%). Fall in prices was noted in **Gram dal** (50 paise per kg, 1.5%) and **Tea** (Loose) (Re. 1.00 per kg, 0.9%).

As compared to the last year, price remained steady of potato. Increase in prices was noted in **Rice** (Re. 1.00 per kg, 7.1%), **Wheat** (Re. 1.00 per kg, 10.0%), **Atta** (Re. 1.00 per kg, 9.1%), **Gram Dal** (Rs. 2.00 per kg, 6.5%), **Tur dal** (Rs. 4.00 per kg, 11.8%), **Mustard Oil** (Rs. 8.00 per ltr., 16.3%), **Groundnut oil** (Rs. 18.00 per ltr, 21.2%), **Vanaspati** (Rs. 8.00 per ltr, 16.3%), **Milk** (Rs. 2.00 per ltr, 12.5%) and **Onion** (Rs. 3.00 per kg, 37.5%) and decrease in price of **Sugar** (Rs. 5.00 per kg, (-)22.7%) and **Tea** (**Loose**) (Re. 2.00 per kg -1.9%) was observed.
