## SUBJECT: MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CROP WEATHER WATCH GROUP HELD ON 29.06.2007.

#### **Presentations in the meeting**

Rainfall & Temperature (As reported by India Meteorological Department, (IMD)

#### MONSOON WATCH

- Southwest monsoon has further advanced into remaining parts of country except some parts of Punjab, Haryana and Rajasthan.
- Northern limit of monsoon passes through Barmer, Jodhpur, Ajmer, Jaipur, Narnaul, Rohtak, Ludhiana and Amritsar.

#### Rainfall during the week ending on 27<sup>th</sup> June, 2007

- Southwest monsoon was vigorous / active along the West Coast during many days of the week. It was also vigorous / active over Andhra Pradesh during first half and over Interior Karnataka and Maharashtra during 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the week.
- Scattered heavy to very heavy falls with isolated extremely heavy falls occurred over Orissa, South Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Rayalseema, Telangana, Kerala, Karnataka, Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra during a few days of the week.
- **Rain / thundershowers** occurred at many places over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Lakshadweep, Gangetic West Bengal & Orissa on many days; Chhattisgarh, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidarbha, Marathawada & Gujarat on a few days of the week. **Isolated to scattered rains** occurred over remaining parts of the country.

#### Warning: Scattered heavy to very heavy falls and isolated extremely heavy falls (>25cms.) are likely over Andhra Pradesh and Orissa during 30<sup>th</sup> June, 07 and over Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha and East MP from 30.6.07 for another 24 hours. Scattered heavy to very heavy falls and isolated extremely heavy falls (> 25cms. are likely over Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra during 29<sup>th</sup> June – 2<sup>nd</sup> July. 07.

• Out of 36 meteorological sub-divisions, rainfall during the week was in excess / normal in 24 and deficient / scanty in 12 sub-divisions.

Cumulative seasonal rainfall (1<sup>st</sup> June to 27<sup>th</sup> June, 2007)

• Out of 36 meteorological sub-divisions, rainfall during the week was in excess / normal in 30, deficient / scanty in 6 sub-divisions.

## Weather Outlook / Forecast by IMD

#### Outlook for the Week Ending on 4<sup>th</sup> July, 2007

- The well marked low pressure area over North & adjoining Central Bay of Bengal is likey to concentrate into a deep depression. Under its influence, widespread rainfall with scattered heavy to very heavy falls and isolated extremely heavy falls (> 25 cms) are likely over Orissa, Chhattisgarh and North Andhra Pradesh during 4<sup>th</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> July, 07. The enhanced rainfall activity is likely to extend into Vidarbha, Madhya Pradesh, Madhya Maharashtra, Konkan & Goa and Gujarat from 29<sup>th</sup> June, 07.
- Decrease in rainfall activity over Orissa, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh during second half of the week.
- Conditions are favourable for further advance of Southwest monsoon in some parts of West, Central and Northwest India.

#### Zone-wise Weather Forecast:

#### North-West India (J&K, HP, Uttaranchal, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, West UP)

• Rain / thundershowers are likely at many places over Jammu & Himachal Pradesh and at a few places over the rest region during 29th June  $-1^{st}$  July, 2007 and decrease thereafter.

#### East India (East UP, Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Orissa, NE States)

- Rain / thundershowers are likely at most places over Orissa and at many places over Gangetic West Bengal and Jharkhand during 29<sup>th</sup> 30 June, 07 and decrease thereafter.
- Rain / thundershowers are likely at a few places over the rest region.

#### North-East India (Arunachal Pradesh, NMM&T, Assam, Meghalaya)

• *Rain / thundershowers are likely at a few places over the region.* 

#### Central India (MP, Chhattisgarh, Vidarbha)

- Rain / thundershowers are likely at most places over Chhattisgarh and Vidarbha during 29<sup>th</sup> June – 1<sup>st</sup> July, 07 and decrease thereafter.
- *Rain / thundershowers are likely at a few places over the rest region during 29<sup>th</sup> 30<sup>th</sup> June, 07 and increase thereafter.*

## South India (Tamil Nadu, AP, Kerala, Karnataka, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Lakshadweep)

- *Rain / thundershowers are likely at most places over Coastal AP and Telangana during 29<sup>th</sup> 30<sup>th</sup> June, 07 and decrease thereafter.*
- Rain / thundershowers are likely at many places over rest region outside Tamil Nadu and Rayalseema where it may be at a few places.

#### West India (Maharashtra, Other than Vidarbha, Gujarat, Rajasthan)

- Rain / thundershowers are likely at most places over Konkan & Goa and Madhya Maharashtra and at a few places over East Rajasthan, Gujarat and Marathawada during 29<sup>th</sup> June – 1<sup>st</sup> July, 07 and increase thereafter.
- Isolated rain / thundershowers are likely over West Rajasthan.

## **Reservoir Status (For the week ending on 28.06.2007)**


- The **Central Water Commission** monitors the live storage of **77** important/major reservoirs, having Full Reservoir Level (FRL) of 134.112 billion cubic meters (BCM), which is about 64% of total reservoir capacity in the country.
- Water stock in 77 major reservoirs increased to 34.54 BCM. The current storage is more than the last year's position of 29.32 BCM (76 Reservoirs) and more than the average of last 10 year's storage of 21.42 BCM (76 Reservoirs).

- There were 59 reservoirs having storage more than 80%, 8 reservoirs having storage between 50% to 80% and 2 reservoirs having storage between 30% to 50% of Normal Storage.
- There were six reservoirs namely Shetrunji (Guj), Vaigai (TN), Vanivilas Sagar (Kar), Rihand (UP), Kakki (Krl) and Bhima (Ujjani) (Maha) having storage less than 30% of normal and there was no live storage in two reservoirs namely Sriramsagar (A.P.), and Kangsabati (WB).

# Price Situation of Agricultural Commodities as submitted by the Department of Consumer Affairs

#### Inflation

The all-commodity inflation rate based on Wholesale Price Index (WPI) on a point to point basis for the week ending 16.06.2007 declined by 0.25 percentage points to 4.03% from the previous week's level 4.28%. The inflation rate was 5.50% during the corresponding period last year.

During the week, prices of most of the essential agricultural commodities namely Rice, Wheat, Atta, Gram dal, Tur dal, Sugar, Groundnut oil, Vanaspati, Tea (Loose), Milk and Potato remained at the same level as they were last week. Rise in prices was noted in **Mustard oil** (Re. 1.00 per kg, 1.8%). Fall in prices was noted in **Onion** (Re. 1.00 per kg, (-)7.7%).

As compared to the last year, increase in prices was noted in **Rice** (Re. 1.00 per kg, 7.1%), **Wheat** (Re. 1.00 per kg, 10.0%), **Atta** (Re. 1.00 per kg, 9.1%),**Gram Dal** (Rs. 2.00 per kg, 6.5%), **Tur dal** (Rs. 4.00 per kg, 11.8%), **Mustard Oil** (Rs. 9.00 per ltr., 18.4%), **Groundnut oil** (Rs. 18.00 per ltr, 21.2%), **Vanaspati** (Rs. 8.00 per ltr, 16.3%), **Milk** (Rs. 2.00 per ltr, 12.5%), **Potato** (Rs. 2.00 per kg, 20.0%) and **Onion** (Rs. 4.00 per kg, 50.0%) and decrease in price of **Sugar** (Rs. 5.00 per kg, (-)22.7%) and **Tea** (Loose) (Re. 1.00 per kg (-)0.9%) were observed.
