SUBJECT: MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CROP WEATHER WATCH GROUP HELD ON 13.04.2012.

Summary observations of the Group on Agenda Items

- In the Pre-Monsoon season (March May), cumulative rainfall received for the country as a whole during the period 1st March to 11th April, 2012 was 24.0 mm which is 44% less than the L.P.A. Out of 36 met sub-divisions 08 met sub-divisions received excess / normal rainfall, 26 met sub-divisions received deficient/scanty rainfall and 02 met sub-divisions received no rainfall.
- In 82 major reservoirs monitored by CWC in different parts of the country, total live storage has decreased from 48.19 BCM on 04.04.2012 to 46.59 BCM on 12.04.2012.
- The incidence of pests & diseases generally remained below Economic Threshold Level (ETL) for all crops.
- The Primary Articles inflation rate based on Wholesale Price Index (WPI) on a point to point basis for the month of February 2012, increased to 6.28% from the level of 2.25% in the month of January, 2012. The inflation rate was 15.89% during the corresponding period of last year.
- Among the foodgrains, inflation for Rice has increased to 1.53% from the previous month's level of 1.35%, Wheat has decreased to -4.18% from the previous month's level of -3.48%; Pulses to 7.91% from the previous month's level of 11.37% and Cereals to 1.71% from the previous week's level of 2.42%.
- The inflation for non-food items has decreased to -2.56% from the previous month's level of 0.55% and for the food items has increased to 6.07% from the previous month's level of -0.52%.
- All-India progressive procurement of Rice for the marketing season 2011-12 as on 13.04.2012 was 299.64 lakh tonnes which is higher than the procurement of 255.57 lakh tonnes upto the corresponding period of last year.

Salient aspects of discussions / presentations in the meeting

Rainfall & Temperature (As reported by India Meteorological Department, (IMD))

Pre-Monsoon Rainfall (March - May) during the week ending on 11th April)), 2012

- Widespread rain/thundershowers occurred over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, West Bengal & Sikkim, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir and West Rajasthan for one or two days during the week.
- Fairly widespread rain/thundershowers occurred over northeastern States and Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim for many days and over Gangetic West Bengal, Orissa, Jharkhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Kerala for one or two days during the week.
- Scattered rain/thundershowers occurred over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Gangetic West Bengal and Chhattisgarh for a few days and over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Orissa, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, interior Karnataka and Kerala for one or two days during the week.
- Isolated rain/thundershowers occurred over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Jammu & Kashmir, Telangana and interior Karnataka for many days; over Orissa, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Tamilnadu & Puducherry, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Kerala for a few days and over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jharkhand, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Rayalaseema for one or two days during the week.
- Weather was mainly **dry** over the rest parts of the country.
- Rainfall during the week (01st March to 11th April, 2012) was 23 met sub-divisions received excess / normal rainfall, 09 met sub-divisions received deficient / scanty rainfall and 04 met sub-divisions received no rain out of 36 met sub-divisions.
- Cumulative rainfall (01st March 11th April, 2012) was excess / normal in 08 met subdivisions rainfall, 26 met sub-divisions received deficient / scanty rainfall and 02 met subdivisions received no rain out of 36 met sub-divisions.

Temperature

Maximum temperatures

- Markedly above normal over Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and West Rajasthan for one or two days of the week.
- Markedly below normal over Gangetic West Bengal and Bihar for many days; over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura for a few days and over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya and Jammu & Kashmir for one or two days of the week.
- Above normal to appreciably above normal over East Rajasthan and West Madhya Pradesh for most days; over Uttarakhand, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, West Rajasthan, East Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat State, Marathawada, Vidarbha and Tamilnadu & Puducherry for many days; over West Uttar Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir and Madhya Maharashtra for a few days and over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, East Uttar Pradesh and Telangana for one or two days of the week.
- Below normal to appreciably below normal over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim for
 most days; over Assam & Meghalaya and East Uttar Pradesh for many days; over Arunachal
 Pradesh and Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura for a few days and over Orissa,
 Jharkhand, Bihar, West Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Jammu &
 Kashmir, Chhattisgarh and North Interior Karnataka for one or two days of the week.
- They were near normal over rest parts of the country.

Weather Outlook / Forecast for the period 11th - 18th April, 2012 by IMD

Outlook for the Week Ending 18th April, 2012

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over northeastern States during the week.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during first 2-3 days of the week and at a few places thereafter.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over western Himalayan region and at one or two places over adjoining plains during the week.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over central, rest east & south peninsular India, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep during the week.

Reservoir Status (For the week ending on 12.04.2012)

- The **Central Water Commission** monitors the live storage of **82** important/major reservoirs, having capacity at Full Reservoir Level (FRL) of **153.33** billion cubic meters (BCM), which is about 72% of total reservoir capacity in the country.
- Water stock in 82 major reservoirs **decreased** to 46.59 BCM from the previous week's level of 48.19 BCM. Current storage is **less** than the last year's position of 55.68 BCM and more than the average of last 10 year's storage of 38.32 BCM.



• There were 60 reservoirs having storage more than 80%, 15 reservoirs having storage between 50% to 80% of Normal Storage, 04 reservoir having storage between 30% to 50% of Normal Storage, 03 reservoir having storage 30% or below of Normal Storage and 02 reservoirs namely Gumti(TRP) & Kabini (Kar) having no live storage.
