SUBJECT: MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CROP WEATHER WATCH GROUP HELD ON 07.12.2012.

Summary observations of the Group on Agenda Items

- Cumulative Post-Monsoon Rainfall for the country as a whole during the period 1st October to 05th December, 2012 is 19% less than LPA. Rainfall in the four broad geographical divisions of the country during the above period was (-) 81% in North West India, (-)28% in Central India, 1% in South Peninsula and (-) 19% in East & North East India.
- Out of a total of 36 met sub-divisions, 15 met sub-divisions constituting 38% of the total area of the country have received excess / normal rainfall and 21 met sub-divisions constituting 62% of the total area of the country have received deficient/scanty rainfall.
- Central Water Commission monitors 84 major reservoirs in the country which have a total live capacity of 154.42 BCM at Full Reservoir Level (FRL). Current live storage in these reservoirs as on 06th December, 2012 was 98.86 BCM as against 108.71 BCM on 06.12.2011(last year) and 93.30 BCM of normal storage (average storage of the last 10 years). Current year's storage is 91% of the last year's and 106% of the normal storage. Major States reporting lower than normal storage are Jharkhand, West Bengal, Tripura, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu.
- As per latest information available on sowing of crops, around 69% of the normal area under Rabi crops have been sown upto 07.12.2012. Area sown under all rabi crops taken together has been reported to be 420.63 lakh hectares at All India level as compared to 419.47 lakh hectares in the corresponding period of 2011-12. Area reported was higher by 1.7 lakh ha. under Wheat, 1.2 lakh ha. under Jowar and 1.9 lakh ha. under Gram. Area coverage was lower by 1.1 lakh ha. under Urad.
- The All Commodities inflation rate based on Wholesale Price Index (WPI) on a point to point basis for the month of October 2012, decreased to 7.45% from the level of 7.81% in the month of September, 2012. The inflation rate was 9.87% during the corresponding period of last year.

- The Primary Articles inflation rate based on Wholesale Price Index (WPI) on a point to point basis for the month of October 2012, decreased to 8.21% from the level of 8.77% in the month of September, 2012. The inflation rate was 10.96% during the corresponding period of last year.
- The inflation for non-food items has increased to 10.82% from the previous month's level of 10.00% and for the food items has decreased to 6.62% from the previous month's level of 7.86%.
- Among the foodgrains, inflation for Wheat has increased to 19.78% from the previous month's level of 18.63%, Cereals to 14.35% from the previous month's level of 14.18%; Rice has decreased to 11.40% from the previous month's level of 12.41% and Pulses to 20.00% from the previous month's level of 29.28%.
- All-India progressive procurement of Rice for the marketing season 2012-13 as on 07.12.2012 was 126.17 lakh tonnes against the procurement of 119.87 lakh tonnes upto the corresponding period of last year.

Salient aspects of discussions / presentations in the meeting

Rainfall & Temperature (As reported by India Meteorological Department, (IMD))

Post- Monsoon Rainfall (October - December) during the week ending on 05th December)), 2012

- Widespread rainfall occurred over Andaman & Nicobar Islands from 29th November to 02nd December, over Jammu & Kashmir on 29th & 30th November, over Himachal Pradesh on 30th November and over Tamil Nadu & Puducherry on 4th December, 2012.
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- Fairly widespread rainfall occurred over Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 3rd December, over Uttarakhand on 30th November and over Rayalseema on 5th December, 2012.
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- Isolated to scattered rainfall occurred over Punjab, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Coastal Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka, Kerala, Lakshadweep, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi and West Uttar Pradesh during one or two days of the week.
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- Weather was mainly **dry** over the rest region of the country.
- Rainfall during the week (01st October 05th December, 2012) was 08 met sub-divisions received excess / normal rainfall, 09 met sub-divisions received deficient / scanty rainfall and 19 met sub-divisions received no rainfall out of 36 met sub-divisions.
- Cumulative rainfall (01st October 05th December, 2012) was excess / normal in 15 met sub-divisions rainfall and 21 met sub-divisions received deficient / scanty rainfall out of 36 met sub-divisions.

- Below to appreciably below normal over Assam, Gangetic West Bengal and Odisha throughout the week, over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Jharkhand, Madhya Maharashtra, Rayalseema and Tamil Nadu & Puducherry from 29th November to 1st December, 2012, over West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir and Rajasthan from 1st to 5th December, 2012.
- Near normal over rest region of the country.

Weather Outlook / Forecast for the period 04^{th} - 12^{th} December, 2012 by IMD

Outlook for the Week Ending 12th December, 2012

- A fresh Western Disturbance would affect Western Himalayas.
- Rain / thundershowers would occur at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Odisha, Gangetic West Bengal and extreme South Peninsular India.
- Mainly dry weather would prevail over rest parts of the country.

Reservoir Status (For the week ending on 06.12.2012)


- The **Central Water Commission** monitors the live storage of **84** important/major reservoirs, having capacity at Full Reservoir Level (FRL) of **154.42** billion cubic meters (BCM), which is about 73% of total reservoir capacity in the country.
- Water stock in 84 major reservoirs **decreased** to 98.86 BCM from the previous week's level of 103.12 BCM. Current storage is **less** than the last year's position of 108.71 BCM and lower than the average of last 10 year's storage of 93.30 BCM.
