SUBJECT: MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CROP WEATHER WATCH GROUP HELD ON 13.01.2012.

#### Summary observations of the Group on Agenda Items

- In the Winter season, cumulative rainfall received for the country as a whole during the period 1<sup>st</sup> January to 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2012 was 16.9 mm which is 198% above than L.P.A. Out of 36 met sub-divisions 23 met sub-divisions received excess/normal rainfall, 08 received deficient/scanty and 05 met sub-divisions received no rainfall.
- In 82 major reservoirs monitored by CWC in different parts of the country, total live storage has decreased from 92.61 BCM on 05.01.2012 to 90.16 BCM on 12.01.2012.
- As per latest information available on sowing of crops, around 97% of the normal area under Rabi crops have been sown upto 13.01.2012. Area sown under all rabi crops taken together has been reported to be 583.37 lakh hectares at All India level as compared to 589.35 lakh hectares in the corresponding period of 2010-11.
- Area reported was higher by 2.3 lakh ha. under Wheat, 1.0 lakh ha. under Maize, 1.2 lakh ha. under Urad and 1.0 lakh ha. under Peas. Area coverage was lower by 3.8 lakh ha. under Jowar, 4.0 lakh ha. under Gram and 3.9 lakh ha. under Rapeseed & Mustard.
- The incidence of pests & diseases generally remained below Economic Threshold Level (ETL) for all crops.
- The Primary Articles inflation rate based on Wholesale Price Index (WPI) on a point to point basis for the week ending 31.12.2011 increased to 0.51% from the previous week's level of 0.10%. The inflation rate was 19.76% during the corresponding period of last year.
- Among the foodgrains, inflation for Wheat has increased to -3.35% from the previous week's level of -3.41%, Rice to 1.70% from the previous week's level of 1.46%, Cereals to 2.03% from the previous week's level of 1.97% and Pulses to 14.72% from the previous week's level of 13.85%.
- The inflation for non-food items has increased to 1.29% from the previous week's level of 0.85% and for the food items to -2.90% from the previous week's level of -3.36%.
- All-India progressive procurement of Rice for the marketing season 2011-12 as on 13.01.2012 was 186.78 lakh tonnes which is higher than the procurement of 162.74 lakh tonnes upto the corresponding period of last year.

### Salient aspects of discussions / presentations in the meeting

## Rainfall & Temperature (As reported by India Meteorological Department, (IMD))

## Winter Rainfall (January – February) during the week ending on 11<sup>th</sup> January)), 2011

- **Widespread rain/snow** occurred over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand and scattered to fairly widespread rain/snow also occurred on a few days of the week.
- Fairly widespread rainfall occurred over Orissa for many days; over Gangetic West Bengal for a few days and over Arunachal Pradesh, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, West Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir, Chhattisgarh and Coastal Andhra Pradesh for one or two days of the week.
- Scattered rainfall occurred over Assam & Meghalaya for many days; over Arunachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand for a few days and over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, Bihar, East Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Tamilnadu & Puducherry for one or two days of the week.
- Isolated rainfall occurred over Andaman & Nicobar Islands and West Uttar Pradesh for many days; over West Bengal & Sikkim, East Uttar Pradesh and Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi for a few days and over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Orissa, Jharkhand, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, East Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Tamilnadu & Puducherry and Kerala for one or two days of the week.
- Weather remained mainly **dry** over rest parts of the country during the week.
- Rainfall during the week (01<sup>st</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2012) was excess / normal in 15, deficient / scanty in 11 and no rain in 10 met sub-divisions out of 36 met sub-divisions.
- Cumulative rainfall (01<sup>st</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2012) was excess / normal in 23 met subdivisions, deficient / scanty in 08 met sub-divisions and no rain in 05 met sub-divisions out of 36 met sub-divisions.

## **Temperature**

#### **Minimum temperatures**

- Markedly above normal over Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi for one or two days of the week.
- Above normal to appreciably above normal over Gangetic West Bengal, Orissa, Jharkhand, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Tamil Nadu & Puducherry for most days; over Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Marathawada, Chhattisgarh, Rayalaseema, Interior Karnataka and Kerala for many days; over Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Saurashtra & Kutch, Madhya Maharashtra, Vidarbha and Coastal Andhra Pradesh for a few days and over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Uttarakhand, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Rajasthan and Gujarat Region for one or two days of the week.
- Below normal to appreciably below normal over Konkan & Goa for most days; over Jammu & Kashmir, West Rajasthan, Gujarat State and Madhya Maharashtra for many days; over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, East Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Marathawada and over Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Gangetic West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi and Karnataka for one or two days of the week.
- They were near normal over rest region of the country.

North-west India - Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi, Punjab, Uttaranchal, Himachal Pradesh, and Jammu and Kashmir. Central India - Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra and Gujarat

South Peninsula - Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu & Pondicherry, Kerala and Lakshadweep.

North-east India - Bihar, Jharkhand, Orissa, West Bengal, Sikkim, Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, and Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

# Weather Outlook / Forecast for the period 12th - 18th January, 2012 by IMD

## Outlook for the Week Ending 18th January, 2012

- Minimum temperatures would rise by 3-6°C over many parts of northwest and adjoining central India during middle of the week and fall by 2-4 °C towards end of the week.
- Rain/snow at many places would occur over western Himalayan region and rain/thundershowers at a few places over adjoining plains during middle of the week.
- Weather would be mainly dry over rest parts of the country during the week.

#### **Reservoir Status (For the week ending on 12.01.2012)**

- The **Central Water Commission** monitors the live storage of **82** important/major reservoirs, having capacity at Full Reservoir Level (FRL) of **153.33** billion cubic meters (BCM), which is about 72% of total reservoir capacity in the country.
- Water stock in 82 major reservoirs decreased to 90.16 BCM from the previous week's level of 92.61 BCM. Current storage is less than the last year's position of 101.25 BCM and average of last 10 year's storage of 74.90 BCM.


