## SUBJECT: MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CROP WEATHER WATCH GROUP HELD ON 26.10.2012.

#### Summary observations of the Group on Agenda Items

- Cumulative Post-Monsoon Rainfall for the country as a whole during the period 1<sup>st</sup> October to 24<sup>th</sup> October, 2012 is 21% less than LPA. Rainfall in the four broad geographical divisions of the country during the above period was (-) 84% in North West India, (-)30% in Central India, 2% in South Peninsula and (-) 13% in East & North East India.
- Out of a total of 36 met sub-divisions, 14 met sub-divisions constituting 30% of the total area of the country have received excess / normal rainfall and 22 met sub-divisions constituting 70% of the total area of the country have received deficient/scanty rainfall.
- Central Water Commission monitors 84 major reservoirs in the country which have a total live capacity of 154.42 BCM at Full Reservoir Level (FRL). Current live storage in these reservoirs as on 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2012 was 112.10 BCM as against 124.76 BCM on 25.10.2011(last year) and 106.59 BCM of normal storage (average storage of the last 10 years). Current year's storage is 90% of the last year's and 105% of the normal storage. Major States reporting lower than normal storage are Jharkhand, West Bengal, Tripura, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu.
- 1<sup>st</sup> Advance Estimates of area coverage and production for Kharif season 2012-13 have been released on 24.09.2012. Area coverage during Kharif 2012-13 has been reported as 1015.02 lakh ha. as compared to 1086.50 lakh ha. in 2011-12 (4<sup>th</sup> advance estimates).
- Sowing of Pulses and Oilseeds for Rabi 2012-13 has been started mainly in Gram and Rapeseed & Mustard respectively.
- The All Commodities inflation rate based on Wholesale Price Index (WPI) on a point to point basis for the month of September 2012, increased to 7.81% from the level of 7.55% in the month of August, 2012. The inflation rate was 10.00% during the corresponding period of last year.

- The Primary Articles inflation rate based on Wholesale Price Index (WPI) on a point to point basis for the month of September 2012, decreased to 8.77% from the level of 10.08% in the month of August, 2012. The inflation rate was 12.22% during the corresponding period of last year.
- The inflation for non-food items has decreased to 10.00% from the previous month's level of 13.75% and for the food items to 7.86% from the previous month's level of 9.14%.
- Among the foodgrains, inflation for Wheat has increased to 18.63% from the previous month's level of 12.85%, Rice to 12.41% from the previous month's level of 10.29%, Cereals to 14.18% from the previous month's level of 10.71% and Pulses has decreased to 29.28% from the previous month's level of 34.39%.
- All-India progressive procurement of Rice for the marketing season 2012-13 as on 26.10.2012 was 59.37 lakh tonnes which is lower than the procurement of 69.73 lakh tonnes upto the corresponding period of last year.

#### Salient aspects of discussions / presentations in the meeting

#### Rainfall & Temperature (As reported by India Meteorological Department, (IMD))

#### Post- Monsoon Rainfall (October - December) during the week ending on 24<sup>th</sup> October)), 2012

- Widespread rainfall occurred over Tamil Nadu & Puducherry on many days, over Lakshadweep on few days and over Rayalseema and Kerala for one or two days during the week.
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- **Fairly widespread rainfall** occurred over Kerala on many days and over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Rayalseema, Tamil Nadu & Puducherry, Karnataka and Lakshadweep for one or two days during the week.
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- Scattered rainfall occurred over Andaman & Nicobar Islands for a few daya and over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Rayalseema, Coastal Karnataka, South Interior Karnataka and Kerala for one or two days during the week.
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- Isolated rainfall occurred over Jammu & Kashmir on most days; over Andhra Pradesh on many days, over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Assam & Meghalaya, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, East Rajasthan and Madhya Maharashtra for a few days and over Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Odisha, West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Marathawada, Karnataka and Lakshadweep for one or two days during the week.
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- Weather was mainly **dry** over the rest region of the country.
- Rainfall during the week (01<sup>st</sup> October 24<sup>th</sup> October, 2012) was 6 met sub-divisions received excess / normal rainfall, 23 met sub-divisions received deficient / scanty rainfall and 7 met sub-divisions received no rainfall out of 36 met sub-divisions.
- **Cumulative rainfall (01<sup>st</sup> October 24<sup>th</sup> October, 2012)** was excess / normal in 14 met sub-divisions rainfall and 22 met sub-divisions received deficient / scanty rainfall out of 36 met sub-divisions.

#### Temperature

#### **Minimum Temperature**

- Markedly below normal over Odisha, Madhya Maharashtra and North Interior Karnataka for one or two days during the week.
- Below normal to appreciably below normal over Assam & Meghalaya and Vidarbha on most days over Odisha, East Uttar Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, over Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, Jammu & Kashmir, East Madhya Pradesh and Marathwada for a few days and over Arunachal Pradesh, Sub-Himalaya West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, West Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Rayalseema, Tamil Nadu & Puducherry and North Interior Karnataka for one or two days during the week.
- Above normal to appreciably above normal over East Rajasthan on most days, over West Rajasthan many days and over Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Jharkhand, Jammu & Kashmir, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat State, Konkan & Goa, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathawada and Telangana for one or two days during the week.
- Near normal over rest region of the country.

## Outlook for the Week Ending 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2012

- A low pressure area may develop over South East Bay of Bengal around 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2012.
- A fresh Western Disturbance would affect Western Himalayan region during 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the week.
- Weather would be mainly dry over West, Central and East India during many days of the week.


## **Reservoir Status (For the week ending on 25.10.2012)**

- The **Central Water Commission** monitors the live storage of **84** important/major reservoirs, having capacity at Full Reservoir Level (FRL) of **154.42** billion cubic meters (BCM), which is about 73% of total reservoir capacity in the country.
- Water stock in 84 major reservoirs **decreased** to 112.10 BCM from the previous week's level of 113.86 BCM. Current storage is **less** than the last year's position of 124.76 BCM and lower than the average of last 10 year's storage of 106.59 BCM.
